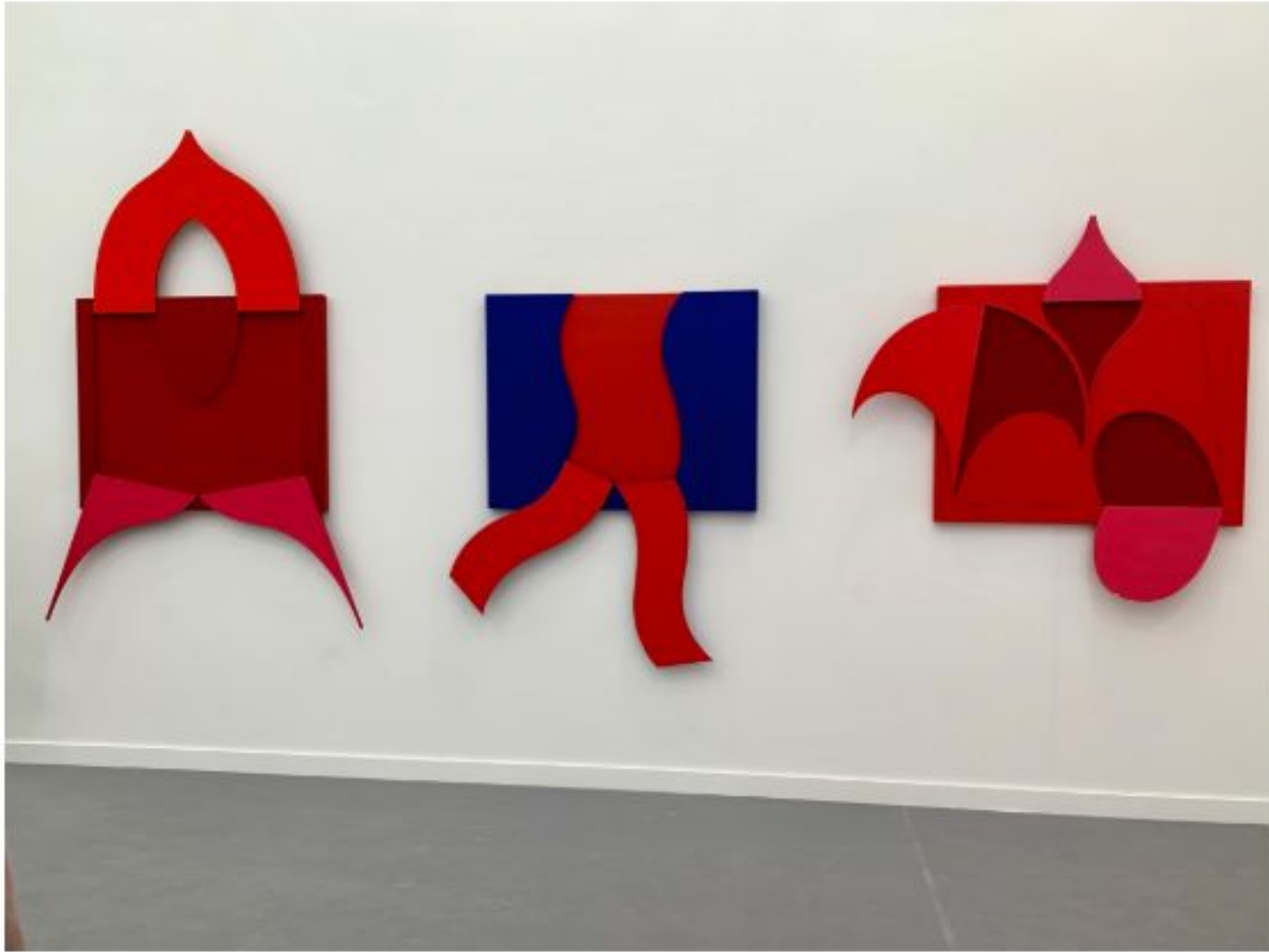


Waiting for the weekend to make the trek to Randall's Island for the 2019 edition of Frieze New York?
